### Winter Glow at Three Counties Showground

Winter Glow is a must-visit event with a magical illuminated trail, ice skating, and a Christmas market featuring local crafts and seasonal treats. Santa's Grotto will be open, creating a festive wonderland for families.

**Location:** Three Counties Showground

### 01: Malvern Hills

- Trail Options: The Malvern Hills offer a variety of trails suitable for all fitness levels. The shorter walks around Worcestershire Beacon provide breathtaking views over the surrounding countryside and are especially magical in winter.
- Highlights: Frost-covered hills, sweeping views, and a chance to explore some of Worcestershire's best natural scenery.
- Facilities: Café stops and parking available at multiple points like British Camp and St. Ann's Well.

### 03: Arley Arboretum

- ◆ Trail Length: 1-2 miles, with plenty of areas to explore within the arboretum.
- Highlights: This historic arboretum is beautiful year-round, with giant redwoods and winter flora. The winding paths and landscaped areas offer a mix of scenery for a cosy winter outing.
- Family Fun: Arley Arboretum has family-friendly trails, including a dinosaur-themed trail for kids.
- Facilities: Café, picnic areas, and parking available.

### 02: Wyre Forest Nature Reserve

- Trail Options: There are various trails to choose from, ranging from 1 to 5 miles, which are easy to moderate, making them ideal for families.
- Highlights: Winter brings a serene quiet to Wyre Forest, one of the largest ancient woodlands in England. Spot wildlife, like deer and birds, and enjoy crisp winter air in the forest.
- Family Fun: There's a fun Gruffalo trail for younger children, making it a great choice for families with little ones.
- Facilities: Visitor centre, café, and picnic areas.

### 04: Croome Park

- Trail Length: Main loop around the grounds is approx 3 miles.
- Highlights: Croome is a National Trust property with vast landscaped grounds, designed by Capability Brown. A winter walk here includes views of the lake, rivers, and an elegant 18th Century mansion.
- Family Fun: Kids can explore the secret tunnels and the RAF-themed playground. Croome also offers seasonal trails with activities for children.
- Facilities: Café, toilets, and parking available.

### 05: Spetchley Park Gardens

- ◆ Trail Length: The garden pathways cover about 1-2 miles, perfect for a leisurely family walk.
- ◆ Highlights: Winter brings a unique quiet beauty to Spetchley's gardens, with frost-kissed plants and scenic lakeside paths. It's a lovely, peaceful spot to wander.
- Family Fun: Kids can enjoy spotting different plants and trees, while adults appreciate the historic charm of the garden.
- Facilities: Tea rooms and toilets.

### 07: Severn Valley Country Park

- Trail Options: Choose from a range of walks, including short loops and riverside paths around 2-4 miles.
- Highlights: This country park has trails along the River Severn with winter views of the river and surrounding countryside. The park also has remnants of an old coal mining site to explore.
- Family Fun: Kids can explore the play areas, and the gentle paths are perfect for younger children or families with pushchairs.
- Facilities: Visitor centre, café, toilets, and parking.

# 06: Broadway Tower and Surrounding Cotswolds

- Trail Length: The walk to the tower is about 1 mile (round trip), but you can extend it to a longer Cotswolds hike.
- Highlights: Broadway Tower offers spectacular panoramic views over Worcestershire and beyond. On clear winter days, you might see up to 16 counties from the top!
- Family Fun: Kids enjoy the novelty of the tower, while parents appreciate the surrounding Cotswolds scenery.
- Facilities: Café near the tower and visitor facilities.

## 08: Pershore Abbey Park and Riverside Meadows

- Trail Length: Short, easy walk suitable for all ages
- Highlights: The Abbey grounds and nearby riverside meadows are peaceful and lovely for a gentle winter walk. The river walk offers chances to see waterfowl and other wildlife.
- Family Fun: With a riverside playground and a short, level path, this is a great option for a quick winter outing with young children.
- Facilities: Café nearby and ample parking.



# Seasonal Home Maintenance Checklist: Winter Edition

Prepare your home for winter with our seasonal maintenance checklist! Keeping up with a few key tasks can help protect your home, enhance energy efficiency, and keep things running smoothly all season long.



### 01: Heating System Check-Up

- Service Your Heating System: Schedule a professional inspection to ensure your heating system is ready for the colder months. Regular servicing can improve efficiency and prevent unexpected breakdowns.
- Replace Filters: If you have a furnace, change the filter to improve airflow and maintain air quality. This should ideally be done every 1-3 months during high-use seasons.
- Test Thermostats: Check that your thermostat is working correctly and adjust programmable settings to reduce energy usage when you're asleep or away.

### 03: Gutters and Roof

- Clear Gutters and Downspouts: After autumn leaves have fallen, clear out gutters to prevent ice dams and damage caused by water backup.
- Inspect the Roof: Look for missing or damaged shingles and schedule repairs to prevent leaks and winter drafts.
- Remove Debris: Remove any branches, leaves, or other debris from the roof and gutters to avoid clogging and potential damage from heavy snow.

### 02: Insulation and Draft Proofing

- Seal Drafts: Check for drafts around doors, windows, and baseboards. Use weatherstripping or caulking to seal gaps and keep warm air in and cold air out.
- Add or Check Insulation: Well-insulated homes are more energy-efficient. If needed, consider adding insulation to attics or basements.
- ◆ Inspect Windows and Doors: If you have older windows, consider using thermal plastic window film or heavy drapes for an added layer of insulation.

### 04: Safety Checks

- ◆ Smoke and Carbon Monoxide Detectors: Test all detectors, replace batteries if needed, and make sure each room is equipped with a working smoke and CO2 detector.
- Fireplace and Chimney Maintenance: If you have a woodburning fireplace, have the chimney cleaned to remove any buildup. Make sure the flue opens and closes properly.
- Clear Pathways and Stairs: Make sure outdoor walkways, stairs, and driveways are clear of debris. Stock up on deicing salt or sand to prevent icy slips.

### 05: Plumbing Protection

- Insulate Pipes: Wrap exposed pipes in insulation sleeves to prevent freezing and potential bursts during extreme cold snaps.
- Disconnect Hosepipe: Remove garden hosepipes, drain them, and store them indoors to protect outdoor faucets from freezing damage.
- Set Up a Steady Temperature: Maintain a consistent indoor temperature, especially if you'll be away. Setting it no lower than 12-15°C can prevent pipes from freezing.

### 07: Prepare for Emergencies

- Create a Winter Emergency Kit: Stock up on essentials like torches, batteries, blankets, bottled water, and non-perishable food in case of power outages.
- Know Your Water Shut-Off Valve Location: In case of a burst pipe, knowing where the shut-off valve is can save you from extensive water damage.

### 06: Exterior Preparations

- Check Siding and Foundation: Inspect the home's exterior walls and foundation for cracks or gaps and repair them to prevent cold air from seeping inside.
- Cover or Store Outdoor Furniture: Move outdoor furniture, grills, and other equipment indoors, or cover them with waterproof tarps to prevent winter weather damage.
- Check Outdoor Lighting: Shorter days mean more time in the dark, so make sure your outdoor lights are functioning properly and consider adding timers or motion sensors.
